
# Using Gale in Context Databases @ Your Library

## **①**Searching:

- Type your topic in the search bar at the top.
- Need help picking a topic? Scroll down and "Browse Issues" to see a list of suggested topics.



## Explore all of the source types:

### **Print Based Sources:**

- \*Featured Content = The best sources to start your search
- \*Biographies = General and focused biographies
- \*Academic Journals = Advanced/focused magazines
- \*Primary Sources= Original documents by/or about the topic
- \*Reference = Reference book chapters
- \*Magazines = General interest magazines
- \*News = Newspaper articles
- \*Viewpoints = Articles focused on a particular side of a debate issue.


## (i) Results:

- When looking at the result boxes, remember to click the link to see ALL of the results. (In the example, 72!)
- The boxes only show the first 3—NOT the best 3!

## Audio/Visual /Digital Sources:

- \*Videos = Watch and listen
- \*Audio = Podcasts, audio clips, etc.
- \*Images = Pictures
- \*Websites = Research Quality Web site links
