How do I get there?

1. Visit the library home page at: <http://www.wmasd.org/hslibrary>
2. Click the link to our digital resources and choose "Test Prep" from the collections
3. From the list of resources, click into *Gale Presents: Peterson's Test and Career Prep* and log in with the library's ID: titans
4. Once you are logged in, you must create a personal profile. Later, you will still access the database by using the library's ID, but you will access your individual information via your personal profile.

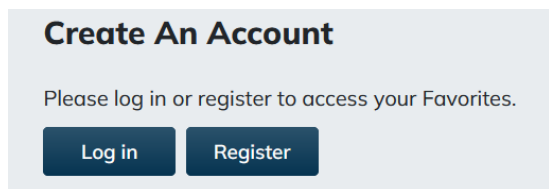

- You must have an email address to create a profile.
- With a profile, you can take each practice test twice every 90 days. To test more frequently, you will have to create a new profile under your account. Each email address can have multiple accounts.

With a Personal Account, you can:

- Save unfinished practice tests midway through the test.
- Save previously conducted college, graduate school, and scholarship searches.
- Create lists of scholarships and awards for which to apply.
- Create lists of colleges for which to apply..
- Create a professional resume using the Resume Builder tool.
