Author - Who owns the web site and why?			
Is the author's name and email address included?			
Does the author explain or list his expertise in the subject area?			
Is the web site affiliated with any major institutions?			
For example: Universities, colleges, hospitals, businesses, non-profit organizations, etc.			
Does the author's connection seem to bias the information? (IF "YES"-DO NOT USE SITE)			
Does the author cite his or her information so that you can check for accuracy and authenticity?			
Does the author have neutral point of view?			
Is there a definite point of view, either positive or negative? (IF "YES"-DO NOT USE SITE)			
Content – Does the site contain accurate, reliable information?			
Is the purpose of the web site stated?
